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Report Snapshot: What Moves the Floating Voter?

A deep look at the three-headed monster informing decisions of undecided voters.

Prologue

In every tight election attention turns to the fence-sitters as each party bids for their vote. Poles make predictions based on the movement of the numbers, but what people say and what they then do diverge widely these days.

In the study, Sympler unpacks hidden reasons people voters remain undecided - even at this very late stage.

We spoke to 100 undecided voters across the 6 key swing states and encouraged them to expose their candid feelings about the race. The winning candidate will be he or she that truly empathises with the emotions driving the choices - not just the stated 'reasons.'

This study was conducted for Creatives fo Harris, a group of 700 creative industry professionals who have organized to create messaging for the campaign. Sympler is an independent research firm that uses ethnographic & projective tools to illuminate hidden motivations.

"I'm **scared of the future** because of policies that may go into effect if Trump is president but if Kamala is President our international issues may not get solved.." -Emu. Currently Undecided

"**The politicians are like puppets.** I'm voting for the lesser of two evils. That's all. Because it best represents my interests."

"I just feel like **nobody in politics are for the people.** It's really for business and how they can get more money. When someone questions what a politician will do for the people it's the same scripted line. But anytime a politician has the opportunity to make the nation better, they decide to do something that will gain them money." -Kiki. Currently Undecided

At face value, there is dissatisfaction about both choices

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On closer inspection, there's a deeper fight: with the **binary**

Undecideds feel let down by a system that treats them as an unthinking entity in order to 'win.' One that forces a binary choice upon them - between 'good and evil.'

Undecided voters aren't stupid. They aren't even entirely undecided, but they are pissed.

They're pissed at the oversimplification of their choices. By the lack of conversation: "Choose A or B, and we're done with you."

They're pissed because their agency was stripped away. They don't just feel unlistened to, they feel used. They want **to matter.**

So the very act of being undecided is a mini protest, a pause, a display of agency and **consciousness**.

Maybe just a little more balance between those two sides." -Lee. Currently Undecided

"There are people in the world called 'yes men'. They say "yes" to everything no matter the consequences or the cost. You, unfortunately, have been labeled as one of those. Take time to assert your beliefs and stances even if they are against the norm. -Janet. Previously Undecided

"I believe you still have a chance to redeem yourself you could really could blossom if do **a little more inner work on yourself** and outer work to gain more perspective from more groups in society to do so." -Kristina, Currently Undecided

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Apply classic advertising channel strategy

Maintain the emotional 'vibes' messaging in the large channels. And keep the policies & the functional messaging for the interactive spaces where voters can navigate themselves.

Independent thinkers will dig in their heels if they sniff any hint of Utopia-washing. By splitting the messaging, you won't accidentally patronize people with policies shouting in the big emotional spaces (like speeches).

Finally, let them know we trust them, that we know it's complicated, there isn't a perfect solution & that we're learning too.

2. Independent thinkers respond poorly to zealots & ideologues

Increasingly entrenched views from ideologically motivated, verbal democrats have had the unintended consequence of pushing their friends to the center or right in search of a place to debate.





The zealotry can overflow into bullying at times.

"It makes me very sad and frustrated to see so many people follow, without question either candidate, only to ensure they're not ousted by their social group. It hurts so many people like me. I actually feel pretty obsessed with it and take a lot of time and energy to deflect the feelings. People think it's a moot issue that the one candidate that touched on topics most related to me was bullied from running and I'm being bullied by one side to vote their way and i must choose whether I'll lower myself to vote the other way or throw my hands up to vote the way so many people in my social group want me to vote is a lot of pressure, even if I know they aren't going to be in that voting booth with me. I try to open people's eyes to what the impoverished are going through, or the misinformation people are fed and I'm either ignored or torn down. They have no clue what it's like to live in my shoes and both sides have also taken it upon themselves to use mental health as a weapon to throw at each other making the work organizations and individuals like myself have fought to destigmatize null. I see the changes in my daily life. "The middle class! The middle class! The middle class" people scream. How can anyone hope to improve the middle class without finding a way to resolve the issues the forgotten class are dealing with?"

Life became an argument with loved ones

"I feel like people have their beliefs upside down. We're in this constant battle against each other if someone's beliefs are different than ours and can't come to an understanding that we have different views. **Life is an argument rather than a conversation.** The political divide over the past decade is mind boggling. I think the next few months will become more dangerous. People are too stuck on their own beliefs that they'll make rash and harmful decisions." -Katee. Previously Undecided.

Don't cut the crusts off their sandwiches. Acknowledge the large & sometimes ugly challenges ahead

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

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'Freedom' is up for grabs & essential for independent thinkers

At first glance it looks like the off-putting factors from both candidates are poles apart, but on closer inspection they are united by a sense of suffocation. The ownership of the 'Freedom' narrative is more available given Project 2025 fears, so more important for both sides than ever. Freedom takes on an even greater value as undecideds hate nothing more than having their power taken from them - especially intellectually.

OVERLY PREACHING & 'PIOUS''

"Right now, I am furious with the Democrats. I used to be one, the turned independent years ago but it's like they feel like they are a cult. You can't show them truths without them disagreeing because they have been manipulated to believe what the "so called" experts are telling them to believe. **Both sides are guilty for it but it is especially worse at this point**, **on the left.** I can't stand the double standards. You can't fight for democracy and bully a third party out of the race. You can't fight for our rights and force censorship. You can't preach bodily autonomy and still punish those unwilling to inject their bodies with vaccines. I could go on." -Kristina. Currently Undecided

"The Republican Party stands in my opinion no longer is for certain ideas but for power & control. They've taken advantage of their opinions and increased their views to strike fear & control others..." -Emu. Currently Undecided

"I am disgusted by the way women are treated by the Republican party. The patriarchal misogyny is too much and no respect for women's autonomy."
